

P4 Home Learning - Tuesday 15th November

Spelling- due Thursday 17th November

This week we are learning words with the spelling pattern of 'ar.' Your child will have highlighted **10** words on a list which is glued into their home learning jotter and should be learnt for this Thursday. Please see the Active Spelling tasks on the website.

Reading

This week's Reading task: due Monday 21st November

Please encourage your child to choose a different Reading Task card each week. A list of these can be found on the Juniper Green class website. The task should be completed in their Home learning jotter or on a separate piece of paper. Please make sure you bring in your Reading Task on the **Monday** so that you can share what you have done with the rest of your group.

Maths:

This week's Maths task: due Monday 21st November.

This week we are focusing on consolidating our learning of the **3** and **4 times tables**. By the end of this term we would like for most pupils to be confident with recalling **all** of their Times Tables (2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12)

We have provided you with a sheet with all of the Times Tables to help your child practise.

Here a few suggestions to help your child learn their Times Tables.

1. Practise counting forwards and backwards by 3s up to 36 and by 4s to 48. For an extra challenge try starting from different points in the times table. E.g 24, 20, 16, 12...
2. Try playing 'Buzz.' Take it in turns to count in 1s and say **BUZZ!** When you reach a station of the Times Table. E.g for the 3x table. 1, 2, BUZZ, 4, 5, BUZZ, 7, 8, BUZZ... You can play this game with as many or as few people as you like.
3. If you are confident enough to try all the Times Tables at once you could try this game. Take a pack of playing cards and remove the Aces and Kings. Count Jack as 11 and Queens as 12. Practise the full range of Times Tables by dealing two cards and asking your child to multiply them.

You can use any of these activities above to help your child learning all of their Times Tables.

Optional Home Learning Task:

As part of Scottish Book week we are focusing on Mathew Fitt's Scots translation of *George's Marvellous Medicine*. Next week in class we will be creating our own Scots translation of a text.

The task is to write down as many Scots words as you know on a piece of paper. Your child may wish to ask grandparents or other relatives for suggestions.
